No Other Commandment Is Greater

"And one of the scribes came up and heard them disputing with one another, and seeing that he answered them well, asked him, "Which commandment is the most important of all?" Jesus answered, "The most important is, 'Hear, O Israel: The Lord our God, the Lord is one. And you shall love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind and with all your strength.' The second is this: 'You shall love your neighbor as vourself.' There is no other commandment greater than these."

This is Mark's record of the Greatest Commandment found in Mark 12:28ff. I want to focus on the statement, "There is no other commandment greater than these." The Greek word for "greater" is "megas" and it means "great, large, and huge." In the NT it's used to describe things that are . . .

- Impressive (Matthew 7:27).
- Powerful (Matt. 8:24).
- Big or large (John 21:11).
- Significant (1 Cor. 12:31).
- The best (Heb. 4:14).
- And even a loud voice (Rev. 1:10).

When Jesus says loving God and loving others is the greatest command, He's telling us there is nothing more impressive, nothing more powerful, and nothing more significant in our lives than living out these two commands. These two commands should speak the loudest about who we are. Jesus said, "By this all people will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another" (John 14:35).

As followers of Jesus, the way we treat others isn't based on how they treat us. How we treat others isn't based on the decisions they make, or the lifestyles they choose. Ideally, partiality and favoritism shouldn't sway our treatment of others either. In 1964, the Civil Rights Acts was passed as public law. This law prohibits discrimination on the basis of race, color, religion, sex or national origin. Jesus preached this in Matthew 7:12, "So whatever you wish that others would do to you, do also to them, for this is the Law and the Prophets."

Loving your neighbor as yourself is how you show the world that you love God with all your heart, soul, and mind. These laws are the totality, the sum, of God's word. Paul wrote, "For the whole law is fulfilled in one word: You shall love your neighbor as yourself' (Gal. 5:14). This includes my Muslim neighbor, my LGBTQIA+ neighbor, my atheist neighbor, etc. Let's allow the Spirit to destroy partiality in our lives and cultivate the love of Iesus in our hearts.
