The Power of Words

Over the next few weeks, I want to devote the bulletin article to giving some thought and attention to the words we use as followers of Jesus. We use words every day to communicate. But our words do more than convey information. Our words have an impact on people. Our words largely dictate how people perceive us. On average, a person speaks approximately 7,000 words a day, with many people speaking more. Allow me to illustrate what 7,000 words looks like.

- The average short story is 7,500 words or less. Just for perspective, *The Lion, the Witch, and the Wardrobe* by C.S. Lewis contains 38,644 words.
- That means, the average person "writes" a short story every single day of their life with their words.
- What short story are you writing with the words you speak?

Words are powerful. Our words can incite hatred and violence, and our words can cause someone to feel loved and cherished. Our words can inflict wounds, and our words can bring healing and comfort. Our words can break a person's spirit, and they can instill confidence and self-esteem. Our words can cause people to feel hopeless, and they can inspire people to do more than they thought was imaginable. Our words can be crushing, but they can also be life giving! Words are powerful! Consider the words of Solomon.

- "With his mouth the godless man would destroy his neighbor" (Prov. 11:9).
- "The words of the wicked lie in wait for blood, but the mouth of the upright delivers them" (Prov. 12:6).
- "There is one whose rash words are like sword thrusts, but the tongue of the wise brings healing" (Prov. 12:18).
- "A soft answer turns away wrath, but a harsh word stirs up anger" (Prov. 15:1).
- "A gentle tongue is a tree of life, but perverseness in it breaks the spirit" (Prov. 15:4).
- "Gracious words are like a honeycomb, sweetness to the soul and health to the body" (Prov. 16:24).
- "Whoever keeps his mouth and his tongue keeps himself out of trouble" (Prov. 21:23).

Our words are so powerful. Words are the most powerful weapon available to humanity. Our words possess the power of life and power of death. Solomon wrote, "Death and life are in the power of the tongue, and those who love it will eat its fruits" (Prov. 18:21). We need to be thoughtful about what we say and how we say it. We need to choose our words carefully. Let's acknowledge the power of our words and listen to God's word. "Let every person be quick to hear, **SLOW TO SPEAK**, slow to anger; for the anger of man does not produce the righteousness of God" (James 1:19,20). Today you will speak approximately 7,000 words. How will you use them?
