#### What God's Word Says About God's Word

The Bible is a fascinating piece of literature. It was penned by numerous different authors through guidance of the Holy Spirit (2 Peter 1:19-21). It's comprised of 66 individual books that form the one Bible. It was written over a span of approximately 1,500 years, and it's the unified story of God that leads us to faith in Jesus as the anointed one of God who gave His life so that humanity could experience salvation from their sins (Matt. 16:16; 1 Tim. 1:15; Mark 10:45; 1 John 2:1,2). When we think about what the Bible says about itself, our minds immediately go to things like inspiration of the Scriptures (2 Tim. 3:16,17) or it's authoritative nature (John 12:48). But the Bible has a lot more to say about itself. Consider these thoughts.

- 1. It's sufficient. "His divine power has granted to us all things that pertain to life and godliness, through the knowledge of him who called us to his own glory and excellence" (2 Pet. 1:3). The Bible doesn't tell us everything we WANT to know but it does tell us everything we NEED to know.
- 2. It's understandable. "Through your precepts I get understanding, therefore I hate every false way" (Ps. 119:104). There are parts of the Bible that are difficult to process and can be confusing, but with some study and effort, the Bible can be understood.
- 3. It's true. Jesus said, "Sanctify them in the truth; your word is *truth*" (John 17:17). "The sum of your word is truth, and every one of your righteous rules endures forever" (Ps. 119:160). In my lifetime, people seem more confused than ever before. Truth eliminates confusion. The Bible is THE truth.
- 4. It's revealing. "Your word is a lamp to my feet and a light to my path" (Ps. 119:105). God's word reveals what is right and wrong: what is holy and unholy; what is pleasing to God and what is not pleasing to God.
- 5. It's precious. The Bible is the most valuable treasure in the universe. It's our food (Jer. 15:16), our life (Deut. 32:46-47), our comfort (Ps. 119:50), our strength (Ps. 119:28), our guidance (Ps. 119:105), our desire (Ps. 119:20), our hope (Ps. 130:5), our love (Ps. 119:97), our joy (John 15:11), and our treasure (Ps.

The goodness of God is seen in the fact He has revealed His will and desire for us in the book we call the Bible and that He has preserved it for us. We don't have to wonder what would Jesus do or what does God think. All I have to do is open up the Bible and read. What a blessing!
