1. Daily Bible reading is a good habit. The best habit we can form as children of God is to listen to God every day. God speaks to us through His word, so when we read the Bible, we are receiving daily instruction from God.

2. Daily Bible reading is a good reminder. Every day I read the Bible, I'm reminded of God. I'm reminded of His love for me through Jesus. I'm reminded truth does exist and I need to embrace it and live it. Daily Bible reading reminds me what's important.

3. Daily Bible reading keeps spiritual things on my mind. So many things compete for space in my heart and mind, but daily Bible reading helps me keep my mind on what is most important. It helps me keep my mind on Jesus!
