Information is of little value until you need it. Generally you are not interested in information until you feel a need for it. Then, for some things, it's too late to try to get prepared.

I think "end of life" issues fall into that category. Maybe more than any other topic. Most people find talking about death and dying unpleasant at best. Then, when we're forced to face it, we're unprepared and terrified. But it doesn't have to be that way. Death is a natural thing. It's as natural as birth. As Christians, it's graduation day. Homecoming day. It's the day we've lived our whole life for. We're crossing the finish line. It's the door to unfettered freedom and joy.

He's ready... even anticipating it. He and my mother have been discussing this scenario for a long time. They've made agreements about it. So last night- actually in the pre-dawn hours of today- he quietly asked her if it was ok if he "let go." A loving, unselfish request. She tearfully replied, "Of course it is; I'll be alright."

Being prepared to die... and to accept the death of our loved ones is, by far, the greatest achievement in life. Christians teach the world how to live... and how to die.
