

IF THE TRUMPET DOES NOT SOUND A CLEAR CALL I CORINTHIANS 14:8

The title above was how the apostle Paul characterized the public image of the church at Corinth. It was written in the context of the insistence of "individuality" by the Christians in that church. They were going to do their own thing – regardless of the affect it had on other Christians. They were going to exercise their rights regardless of the consequences.

We are living in a society that rejects absolutes. There is no one truth. Entertainers have become political activists. Judges want to be entertainers . . . and legislators. Preachers are enamored with social issues [i.e. global warming] and building large churches.

It is difficult for me to imagine what it must be like to be a young person today. What do I believe? Who are my role models? . . . Athletes? Britney Spears? The Kardashians? What purpose do I have in life? . . . Making as big a salary as possible? I'm text-messaging on my IPhone with my IPod in my ear while playing my PlayStation.

The world is full of "trumpets." Their messages are attractive and persistent. They offer easy roads to success. They promise fun and excitement. They will play any tune you want to hear.

What message does the church have for this generation?

"Deny yourself, take up your cross and follow me," just doesn't seem to fit, does it? But that's the message. And it has to be practiced before we can really expect anyone to believe it.

If the sound is not clear and distinct, no one will follow. There's a strong temptation to jazz it up or mellow it out; but then it's your message, not His.

In a time when the world desperately needs to hear a loud, clarion call that is plain and distinct, what sound are you making?
