Things I Learned from Growing Up In A Small Church

Isn't it interesting that the periods of our life upon which we look back with the most fondness are often the times when we had the least? The times when we were "barely getting by?" Maybe it was the first few years of our marriage. Maybe it was when our children were small. Maybe it was when we were struggling in college.

We were experiencing "first-times" in life. Everything was a new venture; many became an adventure. New things tend to be exciting.

We're gaining experience. We're learning things that help us in life.

As I think back to my growing up years — years spent beginning new churches in rural areas- here are some things I learned from growing up in small churches.

First-Church is important. Our life was built around church activities. Sundays were spent attending church at two different locations — twice per day for each. Saturday nights were spent polishing shoes and ironing clothes and getting your bible class lesson book filled out for Sunday. Wednesday nights were for mid-week bible study. A high percentage of summer nights were spent attending gospel meetings within driving distance. I learned that church came first — before everything else.

Second-Every person is important. When you have only a few, you need everyone. If someone was absent, they were called or visited to see what was wrong. Inter-personal problems had to be resolved. It was like dropping a rock into a teacup rather than a lake.

Third-Participation was required. Everyone sang. Almost every man led prayers or "waited on the table." Those who lived nearby took turns mowing the yard. Most women taught children's bible classes, took turns preparing communion, cleaning the building and frying chicken for dinner-on-the-grounds.

That's a few of the things I learned from a small church. I think those things are still important.
