

They Got What They Came For

The stories that Jesus tells are as simple as can be. The message is not hard to understand. But the application—there's the rub!

Do you remember His story about the Pharisee and the tax collector—Luke 18? The whole story is only six verses. It couldn't be simpler. We can all see the word picture of the self-righteous Pharisee standing, praying—probably out loud so everyone could hear. He was good. He was moral—"I'm not a thief . . . I don't practice evil . . . I'm not immoral." He was also religious—"I fast far more than what the law requires. I write a check every week to the synagogue."

Jesus said that the Pharisee came to exalt himself. He wanted to look good. He left with what he wanted.

There's only one verse dedicated to the sinful tax collector. He knew he didn't deserve to even be there. He wouldn't even come close to the altar where the sacrifice was being offered. He wouldn't meet anyone's eyes. He knew what he would see in their eyes. He certainly wouldn't look up at God. He knew what he deserved and he knew he wasn't good enough to go to heaven. So, he humbly begged for mercy. He left with what he wanted.

Why do we come? Do we realize what we deserve? Do we know what we need? You generally get what you come for.

Jesus ends the story with this punch line—"For everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, and he who humbles himself will be exalted."
