That's always our struggle as Christians – maintaining balance in our lives. That's illustrated over and over in the scriptures.

Once we struggle out of the jungle of trying to gain righteousness by being "good enough" (legalism) we now face the next hurdle of antinomianism - throwing off all restraints! The pendulum wants to swing to the other extreme.

Successful Christian living is about maintaining the balance ... avoiding the extremes. Both extremes breed arrogance.

"For in Christ Jesus neither circumcision (legalism) not uncircumcision (antinomianism) has any value. The only thing that counts is faith expressing itself through love." – Galatians 5:6

The Only Thing That Counts

Paul's letter to the churches in Galatia is a plea for Christians to avoid the extremes of legalism and antinomianism. That's a big word that means living without restraints – literally "no

For example, Paul spent the first five chapters of his epistle to the Roman Christians trying to persuade them that righteousness cannot be gained by keeping law. He insisted that righteousness is a gift that is received by faith. "For if those who live by law are heirs, faith has no value and the promise is worthless, because law brings wrath." He is careful to ensure that we understand that law itself is not the problem. "The law is good and righteous and holy." Our problem is our inability to keep law. "For all have sinned" and there is a severe, unavoidable penalty for sin – "The wages of sin is death."

Knowing this, Paul immediately warns (Romans 6:1) -"What shall we say then? Shall we go on sinning so that grace *may increase? By no means (absolutely not)*!" We have been released from slavery to sin so that we can now be controlled by righteousness to enable us to offer ourselves as holy, living sacrifices acceptable to God.
