What is the Basis of Your Identity?

If you were to meet someone who asked you to "tell them about yourself," what would be the first thing you would say? How do you see yourself? What's the most important thing in your life? What single characteristic most defines you? Is it your job? Is it that you are a mother? Is it your political party? Where you were born?

In all honesty, I would likely start my response by saying, "I am a preacher." But I think that is a response that reflects how I think they would see me rather than how I see myself. Don't misunderstand—I do see myself as a preacher, but that's not the most important characteristic in my life. I'm a Christian. That's what defines me.

When my daughters were young I often had discussions with them centered around the statement "I will never ask you to do/not do something because I am a preacher. But I will ask and expect you to do/not do some things because you are a Christian."

There is a difference. A big difference. I hope you can see it. One response focuses on me and my concern about my job; the other focuses on them and their relationship to the Lord. One response says, "You have to focus on pleasing me;" the other says, "I want you to focus on pleasing God." One leads to their belief that my job is more important than they are; the other helps them form their own identity based on pleasing God.

The problems, cares, desires and concerns of life tend to make us forget who we are. We need to be reminded that this world and everything in it will pass away. Don't be defined by the things associated with it.

Remember what Jesus said, "But seek first his kingdom and his righteousness and all these things will be given to you as well."
