Manna in the Wilderness

I like bread. Unfortunately. I really like freshly baked bread. With butter. Occasionally, when I cook wild-game gumbo, I even make hard-crust French bread. I like bread.

Bread has historically been considered "the staff of life" in every society because it is one of the fundamental sources of food required to support (i.e. "staff") life. The general thought is that bread is so basic that we cannot live without it.

In Deuteronomy 8, God, in preparing Israel to enter the Promised Land, is reminding them of how he miraculously delivered them from Egypt and how he had taken care of them for the last forty years while they were wandering in an area that could not support that many people for that long. Listen to him talking to them (through Moses): "He humbled you, causing you to hunger and then feeding you with manna, which neither you nor your fathers had known, to teach you that man does not live on bread alone but on every word that comes from the mouth of the Lord."

What is he saying to them? He is saying your welfare does not depend on normal, natural avenues. God has abundantly demonstrated that he can/will supply everything you need without the things you are convinced you absolutely must have! He can even create something **entirely new, something you never knew existed** ("manna") if he so chooses.

Jesus quoted this scripture in Matthew 4:3-4 when the devil tried to tempt him to turn the stones to bread. By his use of it on this occasion and his application of it we learn more about how he intends us to apply it to our own lives. In essence, he was saying to Satan, "Why would I want to create bread? My Father can keep me perfectly healthy without bread!"

"Man does not live by bread alone but on every word that comes out of God's mouth." Where do we look . . . on what do we depend for our well-being? Physical things? Or whatever God chooses to give us . . . however he chooses to supply it?

Do you remember when the crowds pursued Jesus the day after he had miraculously fed the five thousand? He said I know what you're looking for - you're looking for bread . . . but "Do not work for food that spoils, but for food that endures to eternal life, which the Son of Man will give you."

He gave them bread but then he said, "Man doesn't live by bread alone."
