The Solution is Simple

Over the years of listening to couples with marriage problems, it has become obvious to me that there are a significant number of folks who are not really interested in solving their problem—they are only interested in validating and justifying their feelings/behavior. They want sympathy. They want to tell their side of the story. They want to prove that they're a victim. And that's all they want. They don't really want to solve their problem.

Use that as a backdrop to why Jesus would ask a man who had been crippled for thirty-eight years, "Do you want to get well?"

We can grow accustomed to almost anything. In fact, we can become so attached to our problems, that we wouldn't know what to do without them!

I knew a Christian couple (now deceased) who lived the last fifteen or so years of their life living in opposite ends of their house. They didn't sleep together, they didn't eat together (she would fix each meal, sit down and eat alone, then leave the room and he would come to eat), they rode to church in separate cars (never missed a church assembly) and did not sit together in church. The only communication they had was by telephone. They were not interested in solving their problems.

One of the things that makes all this even more tragic is how simply most (if not all) of our relationship problems can be solved. Notice I didn't say *how easily* they can be solved. It's not easy because it requires us to change. And it's easier to live with the problem than it is to change.

Have you figured out what the solution is? Jesus said it. "Do to others as you would have them do to you."

If you are truly interested in solving your problem, try it.
