GOD IS ON TRIAL

I suppose that men have always put God on trial—both publicly and individually in our mind. Does he exist? If so, who is he? What is he like? Has he spoken to man? Will we ultimately answer to him? I also believe that we become like our god (or absence of a god).

A great deal is at stake in our decision—most of all "who determines what is truth?" Does God determine truth? . . . Does the government? . . . Does each individual determine their own truth? It seems to me that America has increasingly leaned toward there being no absolute truth. Truth is what you decide it is. As the lyrics of a popular '70s song reflect—"So let's leave it alone cause we can't see eye to eye. There ain't no good guy, there ain't no bad guy. There's only you and me and we just disagree."

Like so many other philosophies, that actually sounds pretty good. With that attitude, everyone wins, right? But it's like making a million dollars on paper. It looks good, sounds like a workable plan, but when you implement it, you hit some unforeseen snags that almost always doom it to failure. One of those snags becomes obvious when we try to make laws to govern every individual and every group. Laws are based on truth. There must be some basis for determining right and wrong. Whose truth will we use? When you try to accommodate everyone, you eventually end up with no truth. "Every man does that which is right in his own eyes" . . . then you have chaos. No respect for authority. Sound familiar?

A good example of just such an unfolding saga is seen in the current debate in our Supreme Court on "marriage equality." Will our government recognize homosexual marriage? Why does the possibility that this will become law exist now when everyone knows that this would not have been possible one generation ago? Because God, the Bible, and Truth are on trial. In the words of Supreme Court Justice Ginsburg— "Marriage is no longer bound to antiquated gender roles." Where do you think these "antiquated gender roles" originated? The Bible.

The tide of public opinion in our country is turning away from using Biblical principles as the basis for our laws. That means that Christians are facing more and more opposition. Some will compromise and will also label portions of the Bible as antiquated. Their arguments will sound like a million dollars. And truth will die.

This is not the first time this has happened in history. Joshua said to all the people, "... choose for yourselves this day whom you will serve... But as for me and my household, we will serve the Lord."
