Judge Lou Olivera serves as district judge in North Carolina. In April 2016 four-time deployed Afghanistan veteran Joe Serna faced his court. It was Serna's twenty-fifth time to appear in court. He suffered from post-traumatic stress disorder. Because of a prior DUI conviction, his probation requirement prohibited drinking alcohol. He confessed to having lied about a urine test.

The judge was faced with a dilemma. On one hand, he could simply ignore Serna's violation – setting the law and justice aside. Or he could follow the law and sentence him to jail.

Olivera, himself a veteran, was aware that jail time could push the vet to suicide. He sentenced him to 24-hours behind bars.

Judge Olivera then did a remarkable thing. He drove Serna to the county jail. The cell door closed as Serna sat on his cot. "Then," he said, "the door rattled open and the judge came in and sat on the other cot." The door closed and locked. The judge spent the night with his prisoner.

A microcosm of the gospel.

God entered our world as a man, not to simply demonstrate his sympathy for our plight, but to redeem us . . . to rescue us . . . to heal us. We are guilty. Guilty of sin. And justice demands that we pay the penalty – death! Eternal separation from God. And he didn't simply spend the night with us, he went to the cross in our place. "By his stripes we are healed." He offers us life . . . and freedom! Plus, God promises, "I will never leave you or forsake you."

The cross – where justice and love shake hands.
