DO YOU LIKE WINNING?

Our family has a high level of interest in football this year. Not just any and all football, but one special team in Louisiana. For this one year, our son-in-law is coaching his two oldest sons on the varsity team. They have been looking forward to this year for a long time. They are currently 6-0. Even though they are a relatively small school (2-A), they recently defeated a 5-A school 35-0. Because they are so successful, they are finding it difficult to find any teams outside their conference who will play them . . . regardless of size. It is obvious that they play teams with far superior athletes, but they manage to defeat them fairly consistently.

I see a spiritual lesson here . . . a life lesson. We tend to want a desirable outcome without applying the fundamental plan or design. Let me give you a couple of examples.

The institution of marriage is falling apart all around us. Everyone wants a successful marriage . . . but we are unwilling to follow God's design for marriage. God's design includes purity before and after marriage. It includes a lifetime commitment to that relationship. It involves a tremendous amount of sacrifice—often the sacrifice of things that are important to us. It requires the kind of love that puts the welfare and happiness of your spouse before your own. Not many folks in the world are willing to make that level of investment in our marriage. So our marriage fails.

We all want to rear happy, successful, faithful children. God has a design for that, too. It involves sacrifice—often the sacrifice of things that are important to us. It involves things like family meals . . . time spent together away from television, iPhones and video games. It involves consistently bringing your children to Bible classes. It involves cultivating Christian friends who are a good influence on you and your family. It involves consistently demonstrating that nothing is more important than serving God and being "in church"—even when it's not convenient. It involves consistent discipline—starting with ourselves as parents.

Showing up at the game once per week doesn't often bring desirable results. Commitment to God, His word and living by His design does. But, you must commit yourself to it. When you do, you enlist God's wisdom and power into your marriage and your family. You'll like winning.
