Our God Gives Our Lives Meaning

I've been rereading Viktor Frankl's book <u>Man's Search for Meaning</u>. He was an Austrian Jewish neurologist and psychiatrist who survived three years in Nazi concentration camps—including Auschwitz and Dachau.

After his liberation in 1945, he wrote his world-famous book (above) in which he analyzes why the survivors were able to endure the horrors of the death camps when many others became so discouraged they lost their will to survive, and consequently died.

His conclusion is that the difference was that the survivors had something or someone that provided them hope, or in his words, purpose for the future.

At one point in his imprisonment, based on his experience, he calculated that his chance at survival was one in twenty-eight. Although his mother, his brother and his wife were killed in the camps, he maintained a desire to survive because he saw purpose/meaning in his future.

He observed that when fellow prisoners began talking only about the past and ceased talking about the future, they had lost their meaning in life. They also lost their will to live, became insensitive to everything around them and soon died.

As I was reading, it occurred to me that God, through Jesus Christ, has provided Christians with both a purpose which and a person who gives us every motivation to live with peace and hope to the very end of our lives. We have a living God who loves us and we have a future filled with hope . . . regardless of our circumstances.

If our purpose in life is rooted in anything physical (person(s), job, recreation) it cannot last. The death of a loved one, retirement or aging can rob us of our purpose.

"Though outwardly we are wasting away, yet inwardly we are being renewed day by day. For our light and momentary troubles are achieving for us an eternal glory that far outweighs them all. So we fix our eyes not on what is seen, but on what is unseen. For what is seen is temporary, but what is unseen is eternal." I Corinthians 4:16-18
