You Reap What You Sow

"Do not be deceived: God is not mocked, for whatever one sows, that will he also reap. For the one who sows to his own flesh will from the flesh reap corruption, but the one who sows to the Spirit will from the Spirit reap eternal

Unless you have your head stuck in the sand, you're aware of the opening ceremony of the Paris Olympics. You're also aware of what seemed to be a loose depiction of Leonardo's Da Vinci's painting, "The Last Supper" on the Debilly Bridge over the Seine River with drag queens and a portrayal of the Greek god Dionysus. There has been quite the outrage over the event. Whether the scene was intended to mock the Last Supper or not has neither been expressly stated by Paris Olympic officials, nor has it been denied to my knowledge, but the similarities are very striking. In an article on Yahoo News, Will Bolton wrote, *"The organizers of the Paris Olympics have apologized after a drag queen parody"* of Leonardo Da Vinci's Last Supper featured in the opening ceremony . . . On Sunday, Anne Deschamps, a Paris 2024 spokesman, said that 'clearly there was never an intention to show disrespect to any religious group.'Ms. Deschamps said that the opening ceremony 'tried to celebrate community tolerance.'"

Immediately Christians took to social media and expressed how shocked they were that nonbelievers were capable of such disgraceful behaviors. Other Christians were quick to point out that everyone sins, and we need to love everyone and stop attacking people. We should never make concessions for sin, but we shouldn't be shocked that the world loves darkness. In the days of Noah, "The wickedness of man was great in the earth, and that every intention of the thoughts of his heart was on evil continually" (Genesis 6:5). During the period of the Judges, "Everyone did what was right in his own eyes" (Judges 21:25). Nothing has changed. The world loves wickedness. This is the nature of the world. It's broken. "People loved the darkness rather than the light because their works were evil. For everyone who does wicked things hates the light and does not *come to the light, lest his works should be exposed*" (John 3:19).

Don't be surprised when the world chooses darkness over the light. The behaviors of the world should sadden us, but not surprise us. Our job isn't to whine, gripe, and complain about the offensive actions of people in darkness, and we certainly don't need to mock them back (1 Peter 2:21-24). Believers must shine the light of Jesus, exposing the unfruitful works of darkness while displaying the fruit of the Spirit until Jesus returns and judges the world. On that day, we can rest assured that He will not be mocked. Until then, pray that the LORD will use you to bring someone out of darkness and into His marvelous
