Why Kids Should Attend Church Camp

family and a few others from Woodland Oaks will arrive at Camp Blue Haven on day July 30th. This will be our 21st year to teach Bible class at 4th session. In my ns, I attended a few different church camps. As a youth minister, I took kids to eral different church camps. I am a huge fan of church camps, and here are a few

It's good for our kids/teens to get away from home and their parents. As parents, one of our goals is for our kids to grow up into independent adults. Being away at church camp helps them start the journey of becoming independent. They will have to think for themselves, make their own decisions, and experience the consequences. It might be a struggle but it's good for them to learn some independence and grow.

It's good for our kids to be with other Christian kids. I love for my kids to be around other kids that love Jesus. Church camp is one of the best places for that to happen. They learn how to communicate and develop relationship skills. They will engage in team-building activities, sit around campfires, and eat meals with other kids. At church camp kids make lifelong friends, find college roommates, and some even find their spouse. They learn how to encourage, support, and trust other Christian teens.

It's good for our kids to be around other Christian adults. Studies show that kids who form close relationships with at least 4 other Christian adults, beside their parents, are more likely to stay faithful to the LORD. It's so good for our kids to form close relationships with other adult Christians that can reinforce what parents teach at home.

It's good for our kids to fast from technology. Phones, internet, social media, etc. dominate our days and nights, but they aren't needed at camp and that's a good thing. It's healthy for our kids to go without technology for a week. At CBH 4th session they go without it for 2 weeks. It's so good for them emotionally, mentally, physically, and spiritually to fast from technology. Taking a technology break eliminates so many worries and anxieties and forces them to talk. Not only do they take a mandatory fast from technology, but they also spend a lot of time OUTSIDE! So many kids need to leave the virtual world behind and build real meaningful

It's good for our kids to spend time in God's word. At CBH, kids will attend a 2hour Bible class every day. The kids are highly encouraged to learn memory verses. In Bible class they will learn in creative ways that don't take place on "normal" Sunday mornings. Kids are encouraged to dig deeper, grow their faith, and spend more time in prayer. At CBH kids spend an average of 4 hours a day engaging in some spiritual activity. "Like newborn infants, long for the pure spiritual milk, that by it you may grow up into salvation" (1 Pet. 2:2).

rch camp allows kids to experience things they might not experience otherwise. I 't speak for all church camps, but these things happen at Camp Blue Haven. It's good kids to run through the forest. It's good for kids to go fishing. It's good for kids to sit und a campfire. It's good for kids to sit on the ground and worship the LORD in the dle of nowhere. It's good for kids to wash dishes with their friends. It's good for kids leep outside. It's good for kids to walk everywhere they go. It's good for our kids to with their own thoughts and Jesus.
